### **Adoption Statement**

In accordance with Regulation 19 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulation 2004, notice is given that Eden District Council formally adopted the Cumbria Wind Energy Supplementary Planning Document on 25 October 2007.

The Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) sets out the Council's guidance on assessing proposals for non-domestic wind energy developments in the area of Eden outside the Lake District National Park.
